

Dr. William Curry is an Associate Professor of Neurosurgery at Harvard Medical School. He is the Director of Neurosurgical Oncology in the Stephen and Catherine Pappas Center for Neuro-Oncology at Massachusetts General Hospital, and he is the Director of Education within the Department of Neurosurgery there as well. Dr. Curry graduated from Harvard College and Cornell University Medical College. He trained in Neurosurgery at Massachusetts General Hospital, finishing in 2004. He was then a research fellow for 2 years in the laboratory of Glenn Dranoff, MD at the Dana Farber Cancer Institute. Dr. Curry's clinical focus is on surgery for tumors of the brain and skull base, including minimally invasive techniques. He is the Director of the Brain Tumor Immunotherapy Laboratory at Mass General, where he studies antitumor immunity in patients with malignant glioma and examines novel immunotherapeutic approaches in preclinical models.
